On a beautiful Saturday, September 20th the district's first literacy conference was held at The Holiday Inn in Oshawa with 41 Rotarians and partners enjoying the opportunity to network, share project ideas and plans, and gain information about six different literacy initiatives being implemented in clubs in our district. There were also six Rotarians from District 7010 who brought their own project ideas to share.

The following six initiatives were highlighted:

Another very important initiative was launched - the debut publication of "Rotary Reads", a catalogue of literacy projects put together by the Rotary Club of Belleville's literacy committee and supported by Rotary International's Literacy Resource Group and its General Coordinator Richard Hattwick. This publication describes many literacy opportunities for clubs with a rating scale to help Rotarians decide which project would be best suited to their capacity and priorities. It will be highlighted at the District Conference in October and clubs are invited to consider buying a copy.
