Community Reminders



Student Drop-off & Pick-up Reminder

Many of our students are dropped off and picked up in the morning and after school by car. This can create an unsafe school community if procedures and safe practice are not firmly in place and followed consistently by parents, students, and staff. We cannot stress enough, the importance of following these procedures. It will ensure the safety of our children and reduce the anxiety felt by all parents and students as they commence their work day.

Kindergarten students line up with their parents, guardians or older siblings at the south doors. Please park within the community in appropriate parking areas on the street. Unfortunately, there is no parking for parents available at the south side of the school. This entrance will be closed to vehicles during the school day.

Primary students enter and exit the building using the north doors. We ask that parents of primary students effectively and efficiently use the Student Drop Off Loop, fondly known as the "Kiss 'n Go" at the east-end of the parking lot. **PLEASE DO NOT PARK** your car along the fence when dropping off or picking up your child. This will create traffic congestion and unsafe conditions. New signs have been posted along this fence and we urge all parents to refrain from parking their cars in this area. Vehicles may be ticketed.

Junior students in grades 4, 5 and 6 are capable of walking to school independently if they live in the area. If they are dropped off because they live further away, we ask that parents / guardians drop junior students on the corner of Harrison Road and Old Colony Road (or any other convenient, but distant location) and allow them to walk to the school independently. This will help to reduce traffic congestion and allow the students to develop their sense of independence.

Special needs students are dropped off at the front of the school or on the south side of the building depending on their mobility. Please keep the front of the school free from parked cars in order to accommodate these bussing arrangements.


