'Nobody' becomes somebody

School spirit and developing identity part of learning process at Pringle Creek

WHITBY - Academics may come first at Pringle Creek, but school spirit comes a close

Aside from your typical extra-curricular activities, principal Sue Lunn said the focus at the school is to develop the whole child using four key factors: literacy, numeracy, safe school and student success.

One cool character-building initiative among the Grade 3 classes is "Who is Nobody," a stuffed doll who doesn't have an identity at first, but it's up to the students to make him "somebody" through good deeds. After each initiative, the kids put a souvenir on the doll to give him an identity.

Received a war pin

To date, "Nobody" has helped with Unicef donations and received a war pin after one student wrote letters to a Canadian veteran.

"It helps with academics, the kids are writing about (what they did) in a scrapbook afterwards," Lunn explained.

"They're talking to people, making contact with communities. It's a relationshipbuilding initiative. There the literacy that ties into it, the numeracy when they're counting the money and it ties. into our character education."

Keegan McGonigal, 8, is one of the Grade 3 students who is working on making "Nobody" a real person. He's collecting cell phones because they contain the coltan mineral, which miners are looking for in the Congo. As a result, gorillas are being poached to feed the miners. It's McGonigal's hope to stop the killings.

We can use that mineral over again in a different cell phone and it'd save the habitat and gorillas," he said. We're doing this to help our-

The school, which has 525 students from IK to Grade 8. is among the top schools in Durham region, according to the Fraser Institute study.

Top marks

Pringle Creek also earned top marks in the most recent Education Quality and Accountability Office tests. Its Grade 3 and 6 students were well above the provincial standard in reading, writing and math. Parent volunteers also come into the school to help with remedial reading and writing under teacher supervision. Through the Parent Outreach Grant, the school invested \$1,000 to develop library resources for parents to read up on how they can better help students. We have a resource room here, and every year, we put a lot of money into the resource room based on what teachers think will help," Lunn said. "We're lucky that our scores are high and we have a lot of initiatives in place to support that. We really focus on the whole child."

In one Grade 2 class, there is an ongoing Survivor theme to engage the students. Teacher

Sheila Jakowec raises a tiki torch and signals the students to go to "tribal council," a corner area of the classroom that could double for a Polynesian hut at first glance. One student hugs a stuffed monkey as Jakowec asks the class questions about a storybook.

"It promotes cooperation," Jakowec said. "It makes it more fun and makes them more engaged."

Lunn emphasized that she wants to make Pringle Creek inclusive to everyone.

"If you're not a sports person, we have music," she said. "If that's not your cup of tea, we have different kinds of clubs. Students can shine in all
